Veterinary technicians perform medical tests under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian to assist in diagnosing the injuries and illnesses of animals.

SURGICAL TECHNOLOGIST

\$44,000

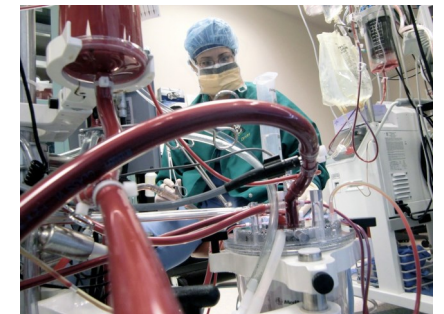
Assist in surgical operations. They prepare operating rooms, arrange equipment, and help doctors during surgeries.

PERFUSIONIST

M

\$79,000

Operates a heart-lung machine, which is an artificial blood pump, which propels oxygenated blood to the patient's tissues while the surgeon operates on the heart.



ELECTROCARDIOGRAM TECHNICIAN

Monitor and test a patient's cardiovascular performance using EKG equipment.

\$81,000

Combine exercise biology with math, physics, engineering and research to study motion. Used to improve the design and effectiveness of sports and exercise equipment as well as improved ergonomics in the workplace.

EXERCISE PHYSIOLOGIST

B M

\$49,000

Assess, plan, or implement fitness programs that include exercise or physical activities such as those designed to improve cardiorespiratory function, body composition, muscular strength, muscular endurance, or flexibility.

ORTHOTIST / PROSTHETIST

B

\$64,000

A certified orthotist and/or prosthetist is an allied health professional specifically educated and trained to make and fit artificial limbs and manage comprehensive orthotic and/or prosthetic patient care.

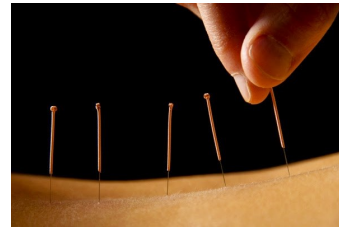


ACCUPUNCTURIST

\$52,000

Acupuncture is a well-studied and effective alternative treatment of many medical conditions. According to the World Health Organization, acupuncture has been proven effective in the treatment of a wide array of complaints, from allergies to headaches and chronic pain disorders.



MEDICAL AESTHETICIAN

Skincare specialists cleanse and beautify the face and body to enhance a person's appearance.

MORTICIAN

Morticians attend to the business of funerals. They work from funeral homes and crematories, embalming, preparing the body of the deceased, and helping the family of manage decisions about the event. They also take part in running the funeral itself, and are involved in many of the bureaucratic tasks that attend upon a death.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN

EMTs are clinicians, trained to respond quickly to emergency situations regarding medical issues, traumatic injuries and accident scenes.



PARAMEDIC

Care for the sick or injured in emergency medical settings. People's lives often depend on the quick reaction and competent care provided by these workers. Paramedics respond to emergency calls, performing medical services and transporting patients to medical facilities.

\$65,000

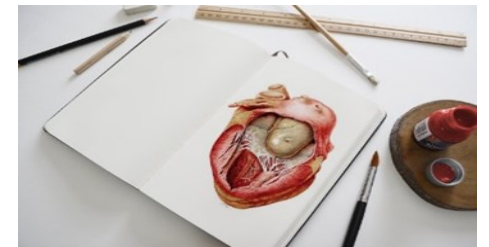
