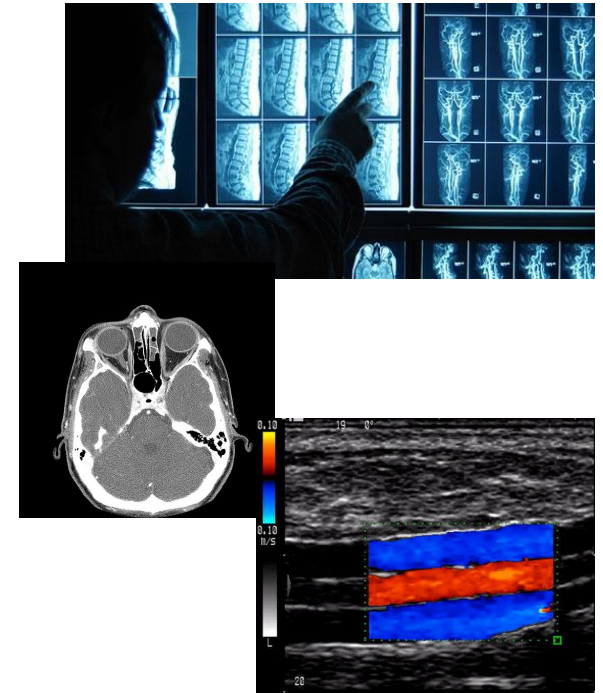

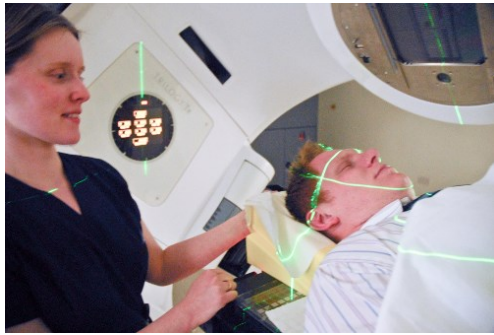


RADIATION THERAPIST

Radiation therapists treat cancer and other diseases in patients by administering radiation treatments.

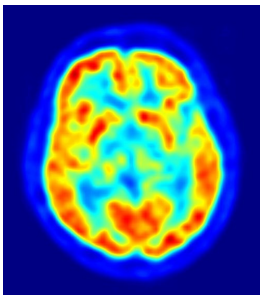


NUCLEAR MEDICINE TECHNOLOGIST

DIAGNOSTIC MEDICAL SONOGRAPHER

Diagnostic medical sonographers, cardiovascular technologists, and vascular technologists; operate special imaging equipment to create images or to conduct tests. The images and test results help physicians assess and diagnose medical conditions. Some technologists assist physicians and surgeons during surgical procedures.

Sonographer:

Ultrasounds for pregnancy and other organs.

Cardiovascular:

The heart and heart vessels.

Vascular:

Vessels throughout the body, not in the heart.
