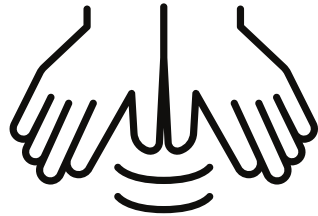


**M****\$43,000****Art Therapy**

Art therapy is a mental health profession in which clients, facilitated by the art therapist, use art media, the creative process, and the resulting artwork to explore their feelings, reconcile emotional conflicts, foster self-awareness, manage behavior and addictions, develop social skills, Improve reality orientation, reduce anxiety, and increase self-esteem.

**M****\$60,000****Dance Therapist**

Psychotherapeutic use of movement to promote emotional, social, cognitive and physical integration of the individual.

**M****\$62,000****Massage Therapist**

Massage therapists treat clients by using touch to manipulate the muscles and other soft tissues of the body. With their touch, therapists relieve pain, help heal injuries, improve circulation, relieve stress, increase relaxation, and aid in the general wellness of clients.

Recreational therapists plan, direct, and coordinate recreation-based treatment programs for people with disabilities, injuries, or illnesses.

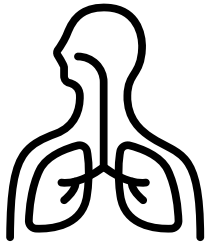
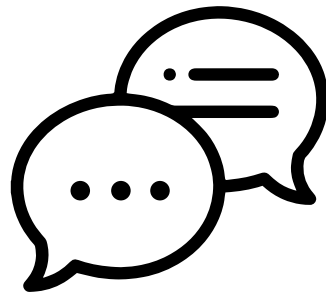

**Speech Language Pathologist**

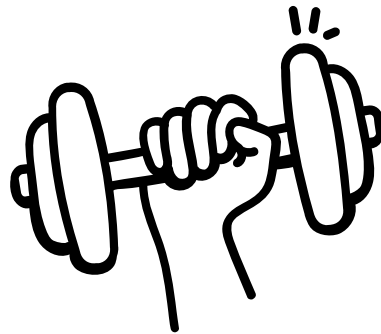
Assess, diagnose, treat, and help to prevent communication and swallowing disorders in patients.

**Athletic Trainer**

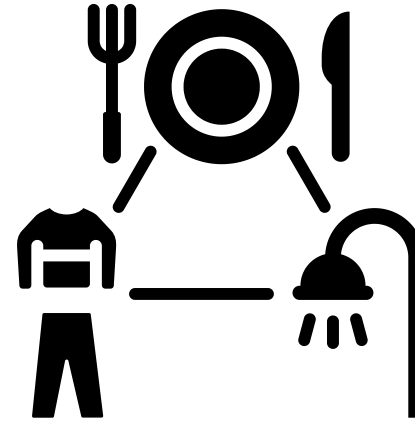
Athletic Trainers (ATs) are health care professionals who collaborate with physicians to provide preventative services, emergency care, clinical diagnosis, therapeutic intervention and rehabilitation of injuries and medical conditions.
